WHAT: This event will provide insight into COP-15 recommendations made by energy ministers at the 3rd Ministerial Meeting of the **Carbon Sequestration Leadership Forum (CSLF)** in October in London. It will also provide a useful introduction to the role of the CSLF, the status of **Carbon Capture and Storage (CCS)** technology and policy around the world, and the relative importance of CCS as one of the necessary technologies to combat climate change. The IEA CCS Roadmap will be discussed in the context of expanding CCS technologies worldwide.
